# **Brief Description:**

Traumatic brain injury (TBI), also called craniocerebral trauma, is a complex injury with a broad spectrum of symptoms and disabilities. TBI's often occur as a result of a severe sports injury or car accident but can also be the result of lack of other forms of trauma to the brain.
